## Department Commander Smith

Kenneth Smith was born in the Barboursville area of Cabell County, West Virginia. He graduated from Barboursville High School in 1960 and enlisted in the

United States Air Force when he turned 18. He was assigned to the Atlas "F" inter-continental Missile Squadrons in Atlas, Oklahoma and Vandenberg Air Force Base in California.

Kenneth returned home in 1964, using his GI bill for further education benefits and began working for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers in Huntington, WV.

He was temporarily assigned to the Marshall Space Center in Huntsville, Alabama and also performed field recovery operations for FMEA after natural disasters destroyed several regions across America. He retired from the Federal government service in 1998.

He is an American Legion Paid Up for life member of Barboursville Post 177 and has served the organization at each of the Post, District, Department and National levels on various commit-

tees and offices. He has been serving as the State of WV Department Commander since July 2015 while also serving on the National Security council.

He volunteers his time at the Huntington VA Medical Center in the Palliative Care Section. He is a treasurer for the Sons of the American Revolution in the General Andrew Lewis chapter in Huntington, WV and serves as a Board of Management member on the society's state level.

He is active in the operation of the Huntington Hub of Honor Flight to provide free transportation to Washington, DC for veterans to visit the war memorials.

Kenneth and his wife Charlena reside in Barboursville and are the parents of Becky, Phillip, and Nancy. Their grandchildren are Justina, Alexandria, and Dakota.

Rhododendron Girls State was started in 1941 under the sponsorship and direction of the American Legion Auxiliary, Department of West Virginia.

Boys State had been started two years earlier by The American Legion.

The first Girls State program started in Illinois and we were one of the pioneers in a citizenship training program for girls.

The program and organization were incorporated under the laws of West Virginia.

A Board of Directors and an Executive Board establishes policies, supervises its direction and promotes its continuance.

Mrs. R.E. Warman of Morgantown was named the first director and with Auxiliary volunteers initiated the program that you will enjoy this week.

Mrs. Warman had been both a Department President and a National Vice President of the Auxiliary.

More than 26,000 have benefited from its training and the annual numbers have grown from 156 to 400 and above.
