A dark, confined, wooden box that measures three feet tall and five feet wide. Everyday there was a soldier in Vietnam who endured minimal oxygen and maximum torture in a box just like this. They were 541 soldiers that were forced to remain on their hands and knees while in these boxes for over nine years.

David Hall provided the American Legion Auxiliary with an in depth presentation regarding the war. A table set for a single person was displayed in the center of the auditorium stage. This table, adorned with several roses, a slice of lemon, salt, a glass, a candle and an American flag that represented those who were not able to return from battle.

David Hall, a Vietnam war veteran, says that if you are to ever see a veteran then you should always make it a priority to thank them for their service and allow them the opportunity to have a proper "Welcome Home".
